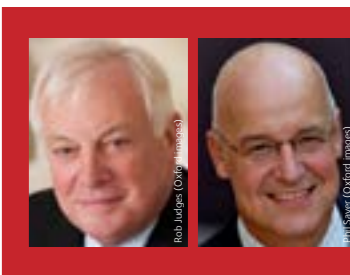
Speakers

Richard Ovenden (Fellow, St Hugh's)

Richard Ovenden has been with the Bodleian Libraries since since 2003 when he joined as Keeper of Special Collections following a career as a professional librarian. He became Deputy Librarian at the Bodleian in 2011 and has just been confirmed in post as Bodley's Librarian.

Professor Chas Bountra (Nuffield Department of Medicine)

Chas Bountra is Professor of Translational Medicine at Oxford and the Chief Scientist at the Structural Genomics Consortium. His current research is aimed at determining the 3D X ray structures of novel proteins, generating novel small molecule inhibitors to dissect disease networks and hence identifying new targets for drug discovery.

Marcus du Sautoy is the Charles Simonyi Chair in the Public Understanding of Science at Oxford. He has written numerous academic articles and popular books on mathematics, including the bestseller *The Music of the Primes*.

Linda Yueh (Fellow, St Edmund Hall)

Linda Yueh is the Chief Business Correspondent for the BBC and presenter of Talking Business with Linda Yueh as well as a Fellow in Economics at St Edmund Hall. Her latest book is *China's Growth: The Making of an Economic Superpower*.

Professor Peter Tufano (Fellow, Balliol)

Peter Tufano is Peter Moores Dean and Professor of Finance at Saïd Business School. His research is focused primarily on consumer finance, bringing ideas from research into practice by working directly with businesses and policymakers. His other streams of research deal with risk management, financial engineering and mutual funds.

Professor Nick Rawlins (Fellow, Wolfson)

Nick Rawlins is Professor of Neuroscience at Oxford. His research lies broadly within behavioural neuroscience, and spans areas including the neural basis of memory, brain degeneration, and pain and anxiety. He is currently the University's Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Development & External Affairs.

Professor Jonathan Flint (Fellow, Merton)

Jonathan Flint is Professor of Molecular Psychiatry, a Wellcome Trust Principal Fellow and a Consultant Physician. His laboratory is investigating the genetic basis of psychiatric disorders, in particular the origins of stress related conditions, such as anxiety and depression.

Professor Xin Lu (Fellow, Magdalen)

Xin Lu is Professor of Cancer Biology and Director of the Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research at the University of Oxford. The main goal of her research is to identify molecular mechanisms that suppress tumour growth and metastasis.

Professor Rana Mitter (Fellow, St Cross)

Rana Mitter is Director of the University China Centre, where he is Professor of the History and Politics of Modern China. His most recent book is *China's War with Japan, 1937-45: The Struggle for Survival* (Penguin, 2013) which was named as a Book of the Year in *The Economist* and the *Financial Times*. He is
